STILL TIME TO ENROLL IN CANTIGNY'S SUMMER DAY CAMPS

Wheaton, III., June 10, 2014 — Parents, no worries: We got this! Cantigny Park is offering three summer day camp options and there's still time to enroll your child.

The following programs are available:

Camp Cantigny

Choose from two 5-day sessions: June 23-27 or July 14-18 9 am to 12 pm each day

Kids ages 7-10 are invited to Cantigny for a week of fun and exploration. Each day will take campers to a different part of the park for activities, games, crafts and discoveries. Cost \$105; parking free.

Pop Art Camp

June 30-July 3 (4 sessions)

1-3 pm each day in the Education Center

This hands-on camp for ages 7-12 explores the work of pop artists Andy Warhol, Jasper Johns, Robert Rauschenberg and other art-world legends. Artist Kari Kraus from Water Street Studios in Batavia provides expert instruction. Cost \$75; parking free.

"Indulge" Art Camp July 21-25 (4 sessions)

1-4 pm each day in the Education Center

Kids ages 7-12 will enjoy exploring one of our basic needs through the world of art. The class, instructed by artist Kari Kraus from Water Street Studios in Batavia, will create a portfolio of "food art" using different art mediums. This will be a fun, educational and tasty camp! Cost \$120; parking free.

Cantigny Park offers a wide range of summer programming for children, including kids concerts, Music Together and Movies in the Park. Many activities and events (including four concerts!) are free with paid parking. See the complete schedule online at the NEW Cantigny.org.

Cantigny is open every day throughout the summer from 7 am to dusk. Parking fees are \$5 per vehicle or \$2 off-peak (after 5 pm). Annual memberships starting at \$50 include unlimited free parking.
