**“VIVE LA FRANCE!” AT CANTIGNY PARK ON AUGUST 10**

**WHEATON, IL, July 31, 2014** — Cantigny Park will host the 6<sup>th</sup> annual “French Connection Day” on Sunday, August 10, from 9 am to 3 pm. The popular free-admission festival debuted in 2008.

The French theme commemorates an important chapter in the life of Robert R. McCormick, Cantigny’s benefactor. In 1918, at age 37, Colonel McCormick commanded an artillery unit in the Battle of Cantigny in France as a member of the U.S. Army’s First Division. It was America’s first significant victory in World War I. Upon returning to Wheaton, the Colonel renamed his estate after the tiny village in France that he and his fellow soldiers had helped liberate from German occupation.

In his will, McCormick established Cantigny “as a public park and museum for the recreation, instruction and welfare of the people of the State of Illinois.” The 500-acre estate was his gift to the community.

French Connection Day is a prime opportunity for families to enjoy the Colonel’s extraordinary gift. Attractions and activities at Cantigny will include:

- French Open Air Market presented by Bensidoun
- French music by “Traveler’s Dream”
- Wine tasting and French food at *Le Jardin* restaurant
- French yard game pétanque (courtesy of Chicago Pétanque Club)
- Performing artists: mime, stilt walker, caricaturist and face painters
- Kids’ art project and storytime with Madeline
- 23-foot Eiffel Tower replica – a great photo opportunity!

French Connection Day is a free event. Parking is \$5 per vehicle (complimentary for Cantigny members).
