GAVIN COYLE HEADLINES MCCORMICK MUSEUM CONCERT APRIL 12

Complimentary performance concludes museum's 2015 concert series

Wheaton, Ill., March 24, 2015 — Cantigny Park's Robert R. McCormick Museum will host a free concert by Irish baritone Gavin Coyle in collaboration with flutist Carlyn Lloyd and pianist Jon Warfel on Sunday, April 12, at 3 pm.

The trio will perform selections from the Great American Songbook, the canon of the most important and influential American songs of the 20th century.

Concert tickets are complimentary, but distribution is by lottery due to limited seating in historic Freedom Hall. **Those wishing to attend should call 630.260.8162 or email register@cantigny.org by April 3.** E-mails should include a phone number. Cantigny will draw 40 names and contact ticket recipients by April 8. Each winner will receive two tickets. Parking at Cantigny is \$5.

The McCormick Museum is open for free guided tours, Tuesday through Sunday. Hours are 10 am to 4 pm on weekdays, and noon to 4 pm on Saturdays and Sundays. Extended hours apply starting in May. More information is online at Cantigny.org.
