

## **Naperville Chamber Players at McCormick Museum on March 10**

*Complimentary performance continues museum's 2013 concert series*

**WHEATON, IL, Feb. 12, 2013** — Cantigny Park's Robert R. McCormick Museum will host the [Naperville Chamber Players](#) on Sunday, March 10, at 3 pm.

The Chamber features Marie Bennett playing flute and Dorothy Deen on cello. The two have performed together since 2003 and often collaborate with guest artists from across the fine arts spectrum. They will be joined at Cantigny by Faye Seeman, principal harpist of the Chicago Sinfonietta and Joffrey Ballet orchestras.

Cantigny will draw 40 names and contact ticket recipients by March 6. Each winner will receive two tickets.

The McCormick Museum is open in February from 10 am to 4 pm, Friday through Sunday. It returns to its usual Tuesday through Sunday schedule in March. Admission and guided tours are complimentary.
