At 11 am, Cantigny Post 556 of the American Legion will conduct a brief remembrance ceremony. Throughout the day, a missing man table will be displayed in the lobby of the First Division Museum. The table and items on it symbolize the sacrifices made by prisoners of war and those still missing in action.
