

Cantigny Fall Festival Celebrates Autumn Fun on October 12

Craft show, scarecrow display, live music, hayrides, petting zoo, pumpkins and more!

WHEATON, IL, October 1, 2013 — The Cantigny Fall Festival, one of the park's most popular annual events, takes place Saturday, October 12, from 10 am to 4 pm.

Festival admission is free with paid parking (\$5 per vehicle). Attractions and activities will include:

A nominal fee applies to some activities: face painting (\$1), petting zoo (\$1), hayrides (\$2) and pony rides (\$2). Kids ages 2 and under are free.

Seasonal treats will be available during the festival at outside concession stands and inside the Visitors Center at Bertie's Coffee Shop. Le Jardin, adjacent to Bertie's, will serve lunch from 11 am to 3 pm.

The remodeled and remerchandised Cantigny Shop, also inside the Visitors Center, will feature a wide assortment of fall décor items and other new arrivals. Cantigny honey and honey-based products such as soap and lip balm will also be offered, plus autumn plant arrangements from the park's greenhouse. Shop hours are 9 am to 5:30 pm.

Hours are 9 am to sunset in November and December. Annual memberships starting at \$50 include unlimited free parking and other benefits.
