Wheaton, Ill., November 13, 2014 — The Robert R. McCormick Museum at Cantigny Park is pleased to offer a complimentary holiday concert by [Kithara Trio](#) on Sunday, Dec. 14, at 3 pm.

Since 1990, Kithara Trio, named for the Greek word “harp,” has captivated Midwest audiences with delightful chamber music for flute, cello and harp. Faye Seeman founded the trio and plays the harp. She is joined by Jill Kaeding (cello) and Susan Saylor (flute).

One of the ensemble’s CDs is “Kithara Wonderland,” a collection of holiday favorites. Kithara Trio’s debut McCormick Museum concert is sure to brighten the holiday season for all who attend.

Concert tickets are free, but distribution is by lottery due to limited seating in the museum’s historic Freedom Hall. **Those wishing to attend should call 630.260.8162 or email register@cantigny.org by December 5.** E-mails should include a phone number. Cantigny will draw 40 names and contact ticket recipients by December 10. Each winner will receive two tickets.

McCormick Museum hours in November and December are 10 am to 4 pm, Tuesday-Sunday, with visits by free guided tour. The museum’s annual Community Trees exhibit opens Nov. 25. In addition, the museum will host a special Open House from 5 to 8 pm during Cantigny Park’s Celebrate the Season Holiday Festival on Saturday, Dec. 6.

About the Robert R. McCormick Museum

The McCormick Museum is a historic house museum interpreting the life and legacy of Colonel Robert R. McCormick (1880-1955), longtime editor and publisher of the *Chicago Tribune*. It is located at Cantigny, the Colonel’s 500-acre Wheaton (Illinois) estate that he left as a gift to the public. Cantigny Park, part of the nonprofit Chicago-based Robert R. McCormick Foundation, is home to 30 acres of spectacular gardens, the Robert R. McCormick Museum, the First Division Museum and a 27-hole championship golf course. All are open to the public.
