

## Metropolis Oboe Quartet at McCormick Museum March 9

*Complimentary performance extends museum's 2014 concert series*

**WHEATON, IL, February 6, 2014** — Cantigny Park's Robert R. McCormick Museum will host [Metropolis Oboe Quartet](#) on Sunday, March 9, at 3 pm.

Chamber music for a new age defines the Metropolis Oboe Quartet, an energetic group known for memorable melodies and lush harmonies. Musicians Deb Stevenson (oboe and English horn), Thomas Yang (violin), Rose Armbrust Griffin (viola) and Steven Houser (cello) perform stellar renditions of both famous masterpieces and lesser-known gems. The close-knit foursome eagerly shares their extensive musical knowledge through playful conversations interspersed throughout the program.

The McCormick Museum is a historic house museum interpreting the life and legacy of Colonel Robert R. McCormick (1880-1955), longtime editor and publisher of the *Chicago Tribune*. It is located at Cantigny, the Colonel's 500-acre Wheaton (Illinois) estate that he left as a gift to the public. Cantigny Park, part of the nonprofit Chicago-based Robert R. Cantigny also is a popular destination for special events, weddings, concerts, lectures, workshops and other recreation and learning opportunities for all ages.
