## **ILLUSIONIST JEANETTE ANDREWS TO PERFORM JUNE 29**

Captivating "Thresholds" show will blend magic and art inside the McCormick House

**Wheaton, III., June 6, 2019** — Tickets are on sale now for a special performance by acclaimed magician and artist <u>Jeanette Andrews</u> at the Robert R. McCormick House at Cantigny Park on Saturday, June 29, at 7 pm.

A sensory illusionist, Andrews will present "Thresholds," an evening of impossible visions, scents, tastes, feelings and sounds. Immersive and highly interactive, audience members embark on a physical journey experiencing elegant magic designed for the five senses in five distinct environments throughout the historic house museum.

Andrews appeared at Cantigny for the first time in 2018 before a sold-out audience. This year's performance, limited to 40 guests, goes beyond a single room with Andrews serving as a magical guide through landscapes specifically designed to awaken the mind and the senses to a state that inspires revelation and wonder.

Tickets are available online at Cantigny.org for \$50 (\$45 for Cantigny Park members), parking included. "Thresholds" is a 90-minute show and intended for ages 18 and over.

Based in Chicago, Andrews specializes in creating performative, interactive sensory magic, offering a contemplative take on the art of the impossible. She uses scientific oddities and sensory anomalies to bridge everyday life to a special, heightened world. Hailed as one of the most innovative illusionists today, Andrews has staged hundreds of performances at museums, theaters and universities across the United States.

<u>Cantigny Park</u> is open 7 days a week from 7 am to dusk. Regular parking is \$5. Parking is free on the first Wednesday of the month and always complimentary for Cantigny Park members.
