
AUTHOR REBECCA SIVE VISITS CIVIC AWARENESS SERIES

Free program on November 18 in partnership with League of Women Voters

Wheaton, Ill., November 3, 2021 — The Robert R. McCormick House at [Cantigny Park](#), the [League of Women Voters of Wheaton](#), and the [League of Women Voters of Glen Ellyn](#) are co-sponsoring an online presentation in the acclaimed Civic Awareness Series featuring Rebecca Sive, author of “Vote Her In: Your Guide to Electing Our First Woman President,” on **Thursday, November 18, at 7 pm CST.**

The program is free, but advance registration is required at [Cantigny.org](#). Registrants will receive a Zoom link before the event.

In “Vote Her In,” published in 2018, Sive examines the urgency of American women to attain equal executive power at all political levels, including the presidency, and offers a comprehensive strategy for every woman to be a part of that campaign.



Sive is the author of three books on American women’s politics and power, a motivational speaker, experienced media analyst, and admired women’s leadership strategist. She is a past faculty member of the University of Chicago Harris School of Public Policy and statewide governmental official.
